

Once there was a doll-maker in small village. He had a son- Shanu. His father always hoped his son would grow up to be the best doll-maker.


One day Shanu said, "Dad, I've decided to leave home and seek my fortune."


He told his son, “Each quality will help you in your journey. But remember, strength and knowledge must always serve wisdom and goodness.”



nature.”



One day a young woman and an old man visited there. Both of them were in ordinary clothes. Watching them, Shanu cried, “Divya!”


He rushed over her knelt before her puzzled father.
