The tiger tried to get out through the bars. He rolled and bit the bars with rage


when he failed.

This and that are used for one countable noun or with uncountable nouns.

These and those are used for plural countable nouns.

This and these point the nouns, that are in hand or near to the speaker. (here)

That and those point the nouns, that are far from the speaker. (there)

Ex.: This is my bicycle. That is my brother's bike.

These are nice flowers.

Those are birds.
