Pen Drive



In our daily life, we use many storage devices like cupboard, book shelf, refrigerator school bag etc. Similarly, a computer uses various storage devices that vary in storage capacity e.g. - floppy disk, CD, DVD etc. These are permanent or non-volatile storage devices.

Let's learn how to save our work on a pen drive.

SAVING FILE ON A PEN DRIVE

Follow the given steps:

Step 1: Insert a pen drive in the USB port of your computer.

Step 2: Right click the 'file' that you want to save on the pen drive.

Step 3: A drop down menu appears. Click on 'copy'.

Step 4: Now, double click on the My computer icon.

A window opens up with all the drives installed on your computer.




Pen drives are faster, hold more data and are more reliable than floppy disks.






Step 5 : Double click on the icon showing the pen drive.




- **Step 6:** A window opens and shows the existing content. Right click anywhere, a menu appears. Select paste.
- **Step 7:** The file that was copied get transferred onto your pen drive.

Another method to save your work on a pen drive is to open the file first. The choose save as from the File menu.

- **Step 1:** A 'save as' dialog box appears.
- **Step 2:** Locate the pen drive and click on 'open'.
- **Step 3:** The 'save as' dialog box shows you the contents of the pen drive. Select the place where you want to save your file and click on 'save'.







SAVE FILE ON A CD OR DVD


It is essential to keep a backup of the data we feed into our computers. If the computer crashes, all data is lost. To save the files on a CD, special software like Express Burn, Nero AG, Pyro, Roxio Creator etc. is required. CD burning (writing) software makes copying important data easy and fast. Follow the steps to burn a CD or DVD.

Step 1: Double click on the CD or DVD writer program Nero icon on the desktop. It opens a window.

Step 2: If you write CD, then select CD from the drop down menu or if you write DVD, then select DVD that appears on the top, and then click on Make Data CD.

Step 3: A Nero Express Essentials dialog box opens up. Click on Add.

Step 4: A dialog box opens. Locate the files in the computer and select one or more files that you want to copy to the CD. Click on Add. Once you have added the files, click on close.




- **Step 5:** The selected files get copied, ready to be burned on to the CD.
- **Step 6 :** Click on Next.
- **Step 7:** Check the two boxes given there. This will verify once your data is burned on to the CD and will allow you to add data later in the same CD.

Step 8: Click on burn.

Step 9: The burning process starts.





Step 10: Once the CD burning process is complete, a message will indicate the successful

completion of the process. Click on O.K. Your CD automatically comes out.

Step 11 : Click on Next.

ADVANCED APPLICATIONS OF A COMPUTER

Touch Screen with Windows

A touch screen is a display which can detect the presence and location of a touch within the display area. Inputs are given by simply touching the right option. There is no need of a mouse or a keyboard. This is commonly used in ipods and mobile phones.

ATM

The full from of ATM is Automated Teller Machine. ATM helps you to take out money around the clock. To do transactions through an ATM, you need an ATM card. The card has a thin magnetic strip which is interpreted by the computer fitted inside the ATM machine. Inputs are given by pressing buttons or sometimes by the means of touch screen.

People think that computer is a complicated machine that involves a lot of clicking and dragging for doing work. But today, there are computers specially programmed to respond to spoken commands. There are various voice recognition softwares that help the computer to recognize the voice commands as inputs given to it and process information based on these commands to give an output clicking and dragging is not squired as the voice

recognition software takes the input through sound waves. The only limitation of this application is that the accent in which the voice command is given, has to match the one that has been recorded in the software.
